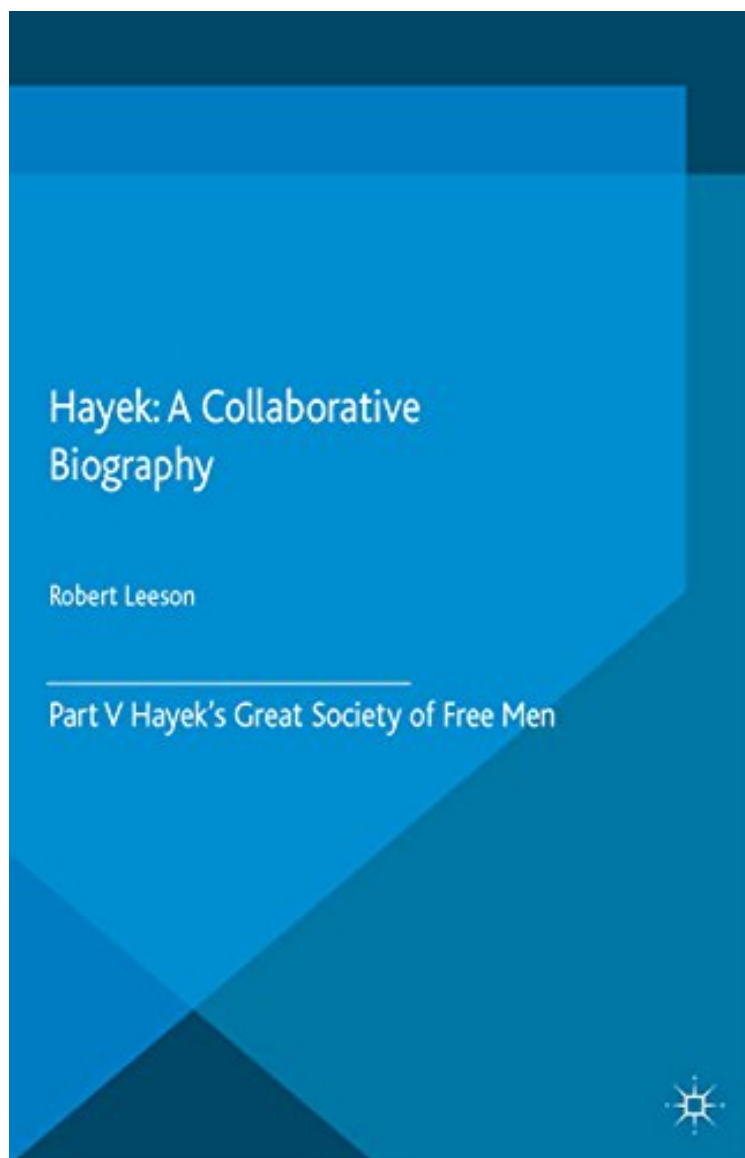


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Free Men (Archival Insights into the Evolution of Economics):
