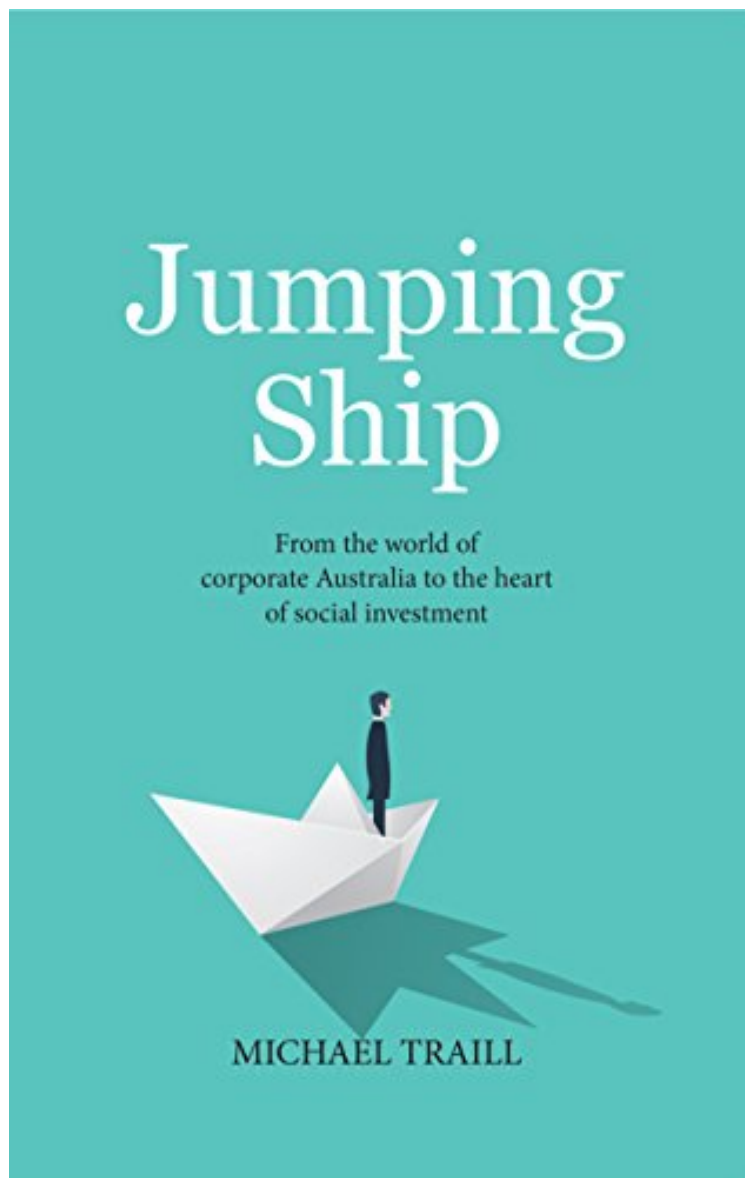

passion and insight, Mr. Traill tells the story of his jump from the corporate world to the "social purpose" world (a term he prefers over "nonprofit" which suffers from focusing on what it is not). As he did so, he brought his savvy, his network, his entrepreneurial spirit, and his energy to the task. The book tells the inspiring story of the launch of Social Ventures Australia and its subsequent launch of GoodStart--an \$800 million chain of daycare centers resurrected from the ashes of a bankrupt for-profit operation. But most importantly, the author extracts the principles of what motivates SVA and makes it work, and what, in turn needs to change in the Australian charitable sector to effect the kind of impacts that are needed. His call for a new focus on (sources of) capital, talent, and evidence is necessary and articulate. Particularly, attractive is Traill's humility in the face of huge success and his willingness to give others credit. His heart for the disadvantaged, ever guided by his head, reveals the warmth of who he is as a product of a poor community himself.
